Workshop #2: Telling the Story Behind Your Family Artifacts, March 11, 10am - 12pm


Artifacts are more than inanimate objects. They tell us stories if we listen: stories about our family heritage, stories about our family values, and stories with deep personal meaning. If you possess treasured family items such as old letters, clothing, photographs, jewelry, military medals, antique furniture, prayer books, or other artifacts, this workshop will help you hear the story behind it and write about what it means to you and your family. To participate in this workshop, please arrive with an artifact in mind and pictures of it — or even bring it with you if it isn't too valuable. Your

presenter will lead you through steps and strategies for writing a personal essay about your cherished artifact.

Workshop #3: Writing Captivating Vignettes for Your Family History, April 22, 10am - 12pm

When we write our family histories, we typically recount important events in the lives of our past and present family members. We consult our family artifacts, listen to grandmother's stories, and perform the genealogical research, but somehow, the family histories we write read like reports and impersonal biographies. There is an antidote: writing short vignettes — short stories with a point and a beginning, middle, and end — about real life people and events in a specific time and place. In this session active writing workshop, your presenter will provide exercises and strategies to help you write an interesting family history vignette that will entertain and educate its future readers.


