On Friday, June 9 in New Orleans, the National WWII Museum will recognize **Shaelyn Fones** as the Arizona winner of the **Billy Michal Student Leadership Award**, given annually to one student from each state and the District of Columbia who demonstrates the American Spirit in his or her community. The student awards are a new addition to the Museum's American Spirit Award, which "honor those who inspire others through their own acts of courage, sacrifice, initiative and generosity—particularly in the areas of leadership, service to country or community, and education." Past recipients of the American Spirit Award have included President George H. W. Bush, Tom Brokaw, Tom Hanks, and many other distinguished

Upon arrival, they joined the ranks of motorcycle clubs, ROTC cadets, Civil Air Patrol units and other civic-minded patriots to await the arrival of the truck. This truck, they learned, made its way across the country, dropping off loads of the most fragrant, lush pine wreaths at cemeteries for this special event. The program began and singers, bagpipe groups, and fellow veterans paid tribute to the veterans who made the ultimate sacrifice for this great nation. Finally, a Gold Star Mother provided a heart-wrenching perspective as to the meaning of every wreath that would be placed that day. She asked that all remember each veteran with gratitude and say aloud every name, because in doing so, their memory would not fade. I was able to lay a wreath on the final resting place of my grandfather (pictured right). It was an unforgettable day for all in attendance and the group looks forward to being there year after year.

She Went to War: Women's Stories of Military Service

On March 11, Barbara Hatch represented VHP by displaying *Since You Asked* and program materials at this special presentation at the Chandler Public Library.

Three women separated by 40 years showed how far women have come in the military. Their primary message about the expanding role of women in the military is that women need to prove their ability to do the jobs alongside men, and advocate for their own needs. They agreed their military service helped them develop an empathy for people in other cultures, mature ahead of their peers, and work with people of many different backgrounds. The women want us all to know that the world "is not as black and white as we want." We need to open our minds to solving world issues by understanding other people and working with them.



Sue Wudy, an Army stenographer for J-3 in Vietnam in the 1960s, Cheryl Rinehart, a Marine who did two tours in Iraq, and Jenna Rohr Pursley, an Army medic in Afghanistan served on the panel. Colonel (Ret.) Wanda Wright, Air Force veteran and Director of the Arizona Department of Veterans' Services, moderated the panel.
