Congressional Medal of Honor Society 2018 Citizen Honors Community Service Hero Award



Receiving the Citizen Honors Community Award from the Medal of Honor Society validated the hard work our team has done over the past 14 years. This includes the over 1,700 students who listened to and documented the stories of over 1,800 veterans; the teacher advisors in our schools who took on the extra task of sponsoring a chapter of VHP so their students could have this first-hand history lesson of hearing a veteran's story; the families of the students, who trusted in the value this program could bring to their young scholar; the volunteers over the years who kept the faith in our mission by rolling up their sleeves to take on any task we needed done; our donors, who dug into their personal finances to sponsor more students and veterans; our Board members, who continue to spread VHP's mission to allow us to grow; and to our veterans, who shared many painful memories to allow our next generation to understand what they must do to keep America strong.

To be among 30 Medal of Honor recipients who are thanking *us* for our service is gratitude beyond measure. We owe them everything. We were grateful to share meals with them at the Ritz Carlton, the Women in Military Service for America Memorial at Arlington Cemetery, and the National Museum of the American Indian, and to be present when they laid a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. Of course, many of our best conversations occurred informally as we happened to sit next to them at dinner or on the bus.

We were also inspired by our fellow Citizen Honors recipients who we are pleased to now call friends.

Robert Engle, selected for his courageous act when he subdued a gunman inside Burnette Chapel Church
of Christ. Engle's actions prevented further loss of life in the deadly shooting.

- Matthew Cobos, selected for his courageous act when he shielded and provided life-saving medical treatment to concertgoers injured in a mass shooting during the Route 91 Harvest music festival on the Las Vegas strip in Nevada.
- Kimberly Scofi, selected for her selfless service in support of veterans through her work with United Military Care and other veterans-based service organizations.
- Virgil Smith, selected for the Young Hero Award for his heroism in using an air mattress to rescue 17 neighbors trapped in their homes during Hurricane Harvey.

We thank the Medal of Honor Foundation, American Airlines, Boeing and Gordon C. James Public Relations for your service in support of veterans. VHP was fortunate to share our story and this award with KJZZ Radio, Channel 12 News and Stars and Stripes. We take this recognition as motivation to continue the work we have begun. How to Establish a VHP Chapter at Your School

Have you ever wondered how to establish a VHP Chapter at your school? Below is our checklist and timeline for identifying, qualifying, and training new chapters. We utilize this process to manage our limited resources effectively and so that our volunteers understand the program components and are equipped for a successful year.

Right Now have an **Informational Conversation** with Program Director Barbara Hatch. She will review with you our **Prospective Chapter Information Packet**. Please contact Barbara at 602-218-4036 x 102 or Barbara@veteransheritage.org.

On April 8, attend our Community Reception and Book Signing so you can witness our mission in action.

Note: optional, yet encouraged.

By June 1, schedule an Engagement Meeting between VHP Program Director, and identified Teacher Advisor(s) and a school administrator.

By June 8, Submit a Chapter Application to VHP for review & approval

This semester Niceville High School AP English students studied the book The Things They Carried, a groundbreaking meditation on war, memory, imagination, and the redemptive power of storytelling. To build on the experience and to introduce Veterans Heritage Project on campus, VHP Chapter Advocate Gretchen Erickson worked with Christy Ellis, Pat Mixon, Jennifer Sjostrom, and Geoffrey Watson, all AP Language and Composition teachers, to host eight Vietnam veterans on February 22. The veterans shared their stories with the AP English classes, students recorded the interviews for the Veterans History Proiect archives at the Library of Congress, and student interviewers will write each Veteran's story to be published in next year's volume of Since You Asked, TM and are planning a book signing reception to coincide with the book publication in the spring of 2019. The theme of the 5th annual Arizona Dept. of Education Civic Learning Conference on March 2, 2018 was Inspiring Student Voices! What organization does this better than Veterans Heritage Project, which asks students to write the service stories of America's veterans? This conference helps educators find programs that help teachers impress upon young people their "rights, roles, and responsibilities as American citizens" to "sustain and strengthen the values that define the United States." Keynote Speaker Mary Beth Tinker participated in the rights of students to

protest in 1969; her case went to the Supreme Court in *Tinker vs Des Moines Independent School District.*Vietnam veteran Mike Burns, pictured above, answered teacher questions at our display and then spoke to interested students on the value of bringing veterans to their classrooms as an integral part of their curriculum, with newly created lesson plans to help them teach about the Vietnam War. Some might even become new VHP schools! The conference concluded with a naturalization ceremony where each new citizen expressed what becoming an American citizen meant to him or her.

Col. (Ret.) James (Jim) Kelsey (SYA Vol. VI, 2010) served two tours in Vietnam and then went on to Military Intelligence, where he handled the first-ever personnel exchange between the Russians and the Americans. Jim describes his job as being in charge of the "Jason Bournes," commanding 26,000 operatives worldwide while he lived in Germany at the time when the Berlin Wall came down. Jim shared his story this month as part of the inaugural Military Associate Resource Group (MARG) meeting at Nationwide Insurance.

Moral injury has been defined as "perpetrating, failing to prevent, bearing witness to, or learning about acts that transgress deeply held moral beliefs and expectations." According to the Moral Injury Project at Syracuse University,

"The effects of moral injury go beyond the individual, impinging on the family system and the larger community. Moral injury must be brought forward into the community for a shared process of healing. In the case of military veterans, moral injury stems in

part from feelings of isolation from civilian society. Moral injury, then, is a burden carried by very few, until the "outsiders" become aware of, and interested in sharing it. Listening and witnessing to moral injury outside the confines of a clinical setting can be a way to break the silence that so often surrounds moral injury."

By sharing their experiences and resulting life lessons through VHP's oral history program and on-going classroom lecture series, veterans receive the positive reinforcement for their service and sacrifice which is so important for overcoming moral injury. At the same time, veterans are able to feel as if they are continuing to serve by helping to instill civic pride, accountability, and respect in our next generation of leaders.
