These programs are offered at both Horizon and Mountain View Community Centers. Afterschool programs follow the same calendar as Scottsdale Unified School District and are drop-in programs, which means that kids can come and go as they wish without signing in/out.



Basic FUNdamentals, positive peer interaction and good sportsmanship are the foundation of the Youth Sports program.

Basketball is offered for kids in grades third thru fifth. Participants play for a team representing their school, and practices are held two days a week on school campus with games on Saturday mornings/early afternoons.

Parties & Events May Require Insurance



If your party or event at a Scottsdale park includes food catering, inflatables, rock walls, petting zoos, pony rides, game booths, canopies/tents larger than 10 foot by 10 foot or other items, insurance may be required. This is to ensure appropriate protection when a vendor provides a service or item in one of our parks (insurance is also required for personally owned inflatables). Many park visitors aren't aware of this, and with the increase in access to these items, we are seeing this request increase each year.

To make your party or event run as smoothly as possible, you can visit the city's website and look to see if the vendor you are looking to hire has already submitted its insurance to the city for approval.

- Check to see if the vendor you would like to use for your event is on the <u>Approved Vendor's List</u>. This is updated weekly.
- If your vendor is not on the list, you can have them complete an online <u>Vendor Application Form</u> at least two weeks before the date you anticipate them to provide a service.
