New Taylor Swift Items on Display

See custom instruments and performance outfits

Since its debut in the <u>Artist Gallery</u> in 2012, the Taylor Swift display has been one of the most popular exhibits at MIM. Recently, some of the items were rotated out to showcase Swift's artistic trajectory.

The new exhibit highlights the *RED* album, which earned Swift American Music Awards as both "Favorite Country Female Artist" and "Favorite Pop/Rock Female Artist." The lead single "We Are Never Ever Getting Back Together" became Swift's first number-one hit on the *Billboard* Hot 100 chart.

"We are excited to share another chapter in her story with all new instruments and wardrobe items from the *RED* Tour," says MIM curator Dr. Richard Walter. "Everything was used by Swift on stage, and guests will be able to see some of the custom details that add such drama and style to her elaborate live performances."

Included in the exhibit are several custom instruments (two guitars, a banjo, and a piano) as well as a microphone (decked out with red rhinestones!). Also on display are two full costume changes, including the outfit Swift wore when she sang "Begin Again" on the *RED* Tour.

With career record sales of over 40 million and more than 130 million song downloads, Swift has become one of the most successful musical artists in the world. MIM is pleased to display some important artifacts from this talented multi-instrumentalist and songwriter.

Eat Local Challenge 2016

Café Allegro invites you to go local

On Tuesday, September 27, the talented team at <u>Café Allegro</u> will again rise to the challenge of creating a meal made completely from local ingredients (defined as coming from within a 150-mile radius of the café).

This year's theme will highlight a common issue that many farms experience: excessive seasonal produce. This occurs when a bumper crop leads to an unusually large harvest. Buying bumper crops helps prevent food waste and helps local farmers get paid for food they may not be able to sell in an oversaturated marketplace.

Which bumper crop will Chef Chris Lenza and his team be working with on September 27? Okra. "September is the end of a long, hot summer season so not much is coming off the farms, but okra does really well in the heat," he says. Look for the menu to feature dishes such as spicy Indian dahl with red lentils, okra, tomatoes, and corn and Caribbean-style steamed fish with coconut milk, carrots, ginger, and fried okra.

Musical play in early childhood is essential. It helps young children reach musical and developmental milestones such as steady beat-keeping and matching pitch, as well as hone their spatial awareness, full-body coordination, and creativity. Additionally, singing supports prelanguage and language development; playing instruments and drumming improve fine motor skills; and movement and dancing teach body awareness.

MIM's Mini Music Makers series, an early childhood music-education program, aims to enrich children's lives by providing a safe, interactive, and engaging environment for kids to explore music from around the world. Each class is structured around developmentally appropriate activities for children to interact with and create their own music.

"I loved seeing Amelia come out of her shell more and more with each class," one parent said. "She loves music and dancing, and I love that through while showing guests the thought that goes into sourcing the meal," Lenza says. "September definitely challenges you to become more creative."

In addition to the entrées, guests will find local coffee, beers, and wine from Arizona producers. Café Allegro is open daily from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.
