Summer Youth Program



In June, STARS welcomed students into the annual Summer Youth Program. This year was the first year that we offered summer programming to youth younger than 12 years old!

In 2010, in partnership with the Scottsdale Unified School District, STARS recognized that there were limited opportunities for youth with developmental disabilities for after-school and summer programming and for transition support. STARS knew that outside of school time, youth did not have a safe place to learn, grow and have fun. In 2011 the STARS Summer Youth Program was born and today we celebrate the completion of our 6th summer.

Summer camp at STARS focuses on social, recreational and life

skills. We provide community recreational & vocational outings. Additionally, our youth have the opportunity to volunteer and of course, have fun. Summer Camp 2016 was a huge hit... our participants especially loved the trips to the Children's Museum, the Aquarium and the Scottsdale Fire Department.

Youth Program Manager Henriette Content-Tavor states that this year's camp highlight is receiving approval from the Division of Developmental Disabilities to develop a Kid's Club for students aged 8-12 years old.

From Dave's Corner

Greetings STARS supporters,

It may sound crazy, but I've been thinking about my tax

Here's why: beginning with the 2016 tax year, Arizona's dollar-for-dollar tax credit for contributions to Qualifying Charitable Organizations (QCO) has been doubled. As an Arizonan resident, I have the opportunity to contribute up to \$400 (\$800 if filing jointly)

and claim a like amount as a CREDIT against my state taxes. This appeals to me for two reasons: I) tax credits serve charities that serve those in our community, and 2) increasing the tax credit donation amount ensures these charities continue to get the funding needed to fulfill their mission.

Doubling my qualifying donation will require a change to my monthly budget, so I plan to spread my contribution across

several months. Consult your tax advisor to determine a plan that's best for you. And yes, STARS is a QCO!
