

Tig Notaro is a stand-up comedian, storyteller and writer originally from Mississippi. She writes, produces and stars in the semi-autobiographical comedy series *One Mississippi*, premiering this fall through Amazon Studios. Her memoir, *I'm Just a Person*, released this year through Harper Collins Publishing, is a *New York Times* best-seller. The Television Academy has acknowledged Tig with an Emmy nomination for her HBO stand-up special *Boyish Girl Interrupted*. Her Netflix Original documentary, *TIG*, premiered to critical acclaim and is available for streaming, and she can also be seen as "Barb" on Amazon's Emmy Award-winning series *Transparent*.

In 2013, Tig was nominated for a Grammy Award for her stand-up release, *LIVE*, which sold more than 100,000 units in just six weeks. *LIVE* is a stand-up set delivered just days after Tig was diagnosed with invasive bilateral breast cancer. Tig has since announced her cancer to be in remission, and remains a favorite on *Conan* and *This American Life*. In her time off, Tig enjoys bird watching with her wife Stephanie, their twin sons and cat Fluff at home in Los Angeles.

Steve Vai is a virtuoso guitarist, visionary composer and consummate producer who sculpts musical sound with infinite creativity and technical mastery.
