**City Council will interview two more city manager candidates.** Queen Creek Town Manager John Kross and former Casa Grande City Manager James V. Thompson are <u>additional candidates who will be considered for Scottsdale city manager</u>. The City Council will host a special public meeting Thursday, Dec. 8, during which each candidate will make a brief presentation. The council may extend a job offer to their top choice at that time.

**Scottsdale launches citizen survey.** Some Scottsdale residents have been randomly selected to <u>participate in a survey</u> to measure their views on the community and city programs and services. Feedback will be used to measure the quality of city services and considered in prioritizing future programs and services.

**"Scottsdale Shares" campaign assists with holiday donations.** The <u>Scottsdale Shares</u> campaign provides one point of contact for residents, businesses and organizations seeking to assist those in need through donations or volunteer activities.

Holiday Lights returns to McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park, Dec. 9-Jan. 1. Take a train ride through festive holiday lights and displays which turn the McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park into a winter wonderland. Opening night festivities begin at 6:30 p.m. Friday, Dec. 9, and include a tree lighting, entertainment and a visit from a special guest – you know who!
