Independence Day information. We wish you a safe, enjoyable Fourth of July holiday. Most city offices will be closed Tuesday, July 4, in observance of the holiday. Below is information about holiday activities, safety tips and city services.

- Cool holiday event options:
 - Scottsdale's Fourth of July Celebration The event starts at 3 p.m. indoors at WestWorld and includes a kids' zone, pony rides, a petting zoo, BMX show, stunt dogs and a bull riding competition. Fireworks begin at 9 p.m.
 - <u>City aquatic centers</u> The Cactus, Chaparral, Eldorado and McDowell Mountain Ranch aquatic centers are open Tuesday, July 4, for public and lap swimming. You can enjoy the fitness centers too! Regular pool admission fees apply.
- <u>Fireworks restrictions</u> in place. Use of fireworks is prohibited in Scottsdale's
 McDowell Sonoran Preserve and Pinnacle Peak Park and all properties located within
 1 mile of these fragile desert lands. They're also prohibited on all publicly owned
 properties. Violation of these restrictions is a civil offense punishable by citations
 and fines.
- <u>Preserve</u> to close at 3 p.m. Tuesday, July 4, to reduce the threat of wildfire. Scottsdale police, staff and volunteer stewards will patrol the area to advise visitors about the closure and fire threat. Violating the closure is a misdemeanor punishable by up to four months in jail and a \$750 fine. The preserve will re-open at 4:52 a.m. on Wednesday, July 5.
- <u>Pinnacle Peak Park</u> remains open July 4. The park, 26802 N. 102nd Way, will be open on Independence Day from 5 a.m. until 8 p.m. For more information about the park, contact park staff at 480-312-0990.
