"Beat the Heat" provided assistance to 271 Scottsdale seniors in need. Care packages consisting of donated water, food, snacks and other relief items were delivered by the Human Services staff this summer. These deliveries not only helped residents, they also allowed city social workers to assess the growing needs of homebound seniors. With the support of Scottsdale Community Partners and local donors, the department provided an estimated \$20,000 in supplies to program recipients.
