We just hit 63 groups [registered](#) for the citywide cleanup this weekend. That ties the all time record for the fall. You guys are amazing!

I just received word that the Adopt-a-Road safety vests are now ready for pickup. I'm going to drive over to Tempe to get them and then drive to Horizon Park to drop them off to the Horizon staff. They will be available by approx. 3pm today. We will have them at both locations (Horizon Park, 15444 N 100th St and the School Rd). All supplies will be available until Thursday at the end of day. I'll be picking them up from Horizon on Friday.

Thanks to everyone who has been patient as we worked thru these supply headaches. Remember to thank the Horizon Staff for letting us use their building as a drop off spot. If they weren't so wonderful, you guys would have to drive to Indian School to pick up your supplies!

Reminders:

- Take a photo of your group – ideally around your sign. Everyone should be wearing the safety vests in the photo. And please send that photo to me.
- Please make sure all attendees are wearing the safety vest when they are picking up trash.
- You DON'T have to clean the medians. It's dangerous to cross the street that much and dangerous in the median.

Stick to sidewalk/walk way next to the roadway. Volunteers need to sign the Participant Agreement Form ([PAF](#)).

If you have someone cleaning between the ages of 12-18, then please have their parents sign the PAF before they start cleaning.

- Please tell your volunteers not to pick up dangerous items (needles, glass, anything dangerous) not to harm native plants or dead animals if you run into them. Please contact Bruce after the cleanup and he'll arrange a city crew to take care of them.

Looking forward to a great citywide cleanup in celebration of Earth Day!
